## DOCTORAL SCHOLARSHIP

The research scholarship is associated with the Canada Research Chair in Community Approaches and Health Inequalities (CACIS) of the Université de Montréal. It is part of a wider programmatic research agenda addressing health promotion that brings together researchers from various disciplines and universities who are conducting research with public institution partners, including public health departments, municipalities, and community groups. This network develops diverse research projects involving interventions designed to reduce social health inequalities and foster a reflective process, with the aim of documenting exchanges between the actors involved as well as partnership and participatory research practices.

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**Amount:** \$22,500. **Duration:** one year (September 2014 to August 2015), renewable for one year.

### Eligibility requirements

1. Develop and conduct a research project under the direction of the Chairholder of the CACIS (with or without a co-director) addressing inter-sector actions to promote health.
2. Hold a research master's degree from a recognized university in Québec, Canada, or abroad in the field of social sciences and humanities or public health.
3. Be enrolled in a doctoral program in health promotion at the Université de Montréal in September 2014, and be interested in participatory research approaches.
4. Commit to participate in the Chair's scientific activities, and particularly during the first year, contribute to data collection in collaboration with local and regional actors, and develop a doctoral project in line with the Chair's objectives.
5. Commit to apply for a scholarship to recognized funding organizations (IRSC, CRSH, etc.).
6. Be comfortable working in French.

### Documents to submit

1. A letter of motivation describing your academic path, your career plans, and how your research interests align with research in health promotion
2. Your curriculum vitae, including education and qualifications, grants, prizes, distinctions, publications, presentations, and research experience
3. An official copy of your university records
4. Two letters of appreciation, including one from the director of your master's program.

### Selection criteria

The selection committee will use the following criteria to evaluate candidates:

1. Excellence of academic record
2. Research and field study experience
3. Knowledge of interventions in environments involving institutional and community actors.

Applications must be received by **Friday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2014, 5:00 p.m.**
